



Checklist for complying with the new pool pump requirements

Suppliers of swimming pool and spa pool pumps need to make sure applicable pumps meet the mandatory energy efficiency requirements that start on 1 October 2022.

This checklist will help suppliers determine what they need to do to meet the new requirements.

Supplying pool pumps

- Check if your pool pump is covered under the [new requirements](#)
- If your pump is covered, check whether it meets the new Minimum Energy Performance Standards
- If your pump does meet the Minimum Energy Performance Standards, make sure that the pump has been [registered](#)
 - Make sure that you do not manufacture or import any pool pumps covered under the new requirements *that cannot meet the new Minimum Energy Performance Standards* after 1 October 2022
- Make sure that Energy Rating Labels are included in the packaging for each registered pool pump that was manufactured in or imported into Australia after 1 October 2022

Displaying pool pumps for sale

- Make sure that Energy Rating Labels are clearly displayed for registered pumps manufactured in or imported into Australia after 1 October 2022
 - If the pumps are displayed in their packaging, make sure that there is a label on the outside of each package
 - If one or more pumps are on display outside of their packaging, then make sure they have either:
 - a label directly applied to the product,
 - attached to it on double-sided swing tag, or
 - attached on a non-rotating single-sided swing tag
- Make sure that the Energy Rating Label is visible and not peeling off, damaged, or covered by promotional material, stickers or other writing
